1 in every 4 searches on Google is for porn. Have you ever thought about these?

It happens - ex partners may post your intimate images and personal information on revenge porn sites.

It's hard to believe when you are at the start of a relationship but think about this when you are sharing images or videos...there is no way of doing this without any risk.

There's a danger that any image you upload may end up on other sites.

Worried you've seen a sexual image or video online of someone under 18? You may have accidentally stumbled across child sexual abuse.

Don't ignore it! Do the right thing!
Report the website anonymously and confidentially to www.iwf.org.uk. This will help remove the content and may help rescue a child from abuse.

No details are taken from you, unless you choose to and you will get feedback on your report.

A large proportion of porn on the web is posted without knowledge of the 'star'. Have you done glamour modelling? Can you be sure where those images are?

Some porn is illegal, for example violent porn or torture. You are breaking the law by viewing or sharing it and risking prosecution or possible expulsion from University. Remember, ISPs can provide evidence in court of your browsing history.
